What Is An Electric Van?

An electric van is a commercial vehicle powered entirely by electricity rather than a traditional diesel engine.

Instead of using fuel from a tank, an electric van stores energy in a high-voltage rechargeable battery. That energy is used to power an electric motor, which drives the vehicle smoothly and efficiently.

Once the battery begins to run low, the vehicle can be recharged using a home charger, a workplace charging point or one of the UK's expanding public charging networks.

Although the technology is different, the purpose of an electric van remains exactly the same.

How Does An Electric Van Work?

The Battery

The battery is the heart of every electric van. It stores electrical energy, much like a fuel tank stores diesel, and supplies power to the vehicle's electric motor. Battery sizes vary between manufacturers and models, influencing the distance a van can travel before it needs to be recharged.

The Electric Motor

Rather than using an internal combustion engine, electric vans are powered by an electric motor. One of the biggest differences drivers notice is the instant delivery of power, providing smooth acceleration and making electric vans particularly well suited to urban driving and stop-start traffic.

Charging System

Charging is simple. Depending on your business and daily routine, an electric van can be charged overnight at home, at your workplace or by using the UK's growing network of public charging stations.

Regenerative Braking

Most electric vans use regenerative braking technology. When the driver slows down or applies the brakes, some of the energy normally lost during braking is recovered and returned to the battery. This helps improve efficiency and maximise the vehicle's driving range.
